

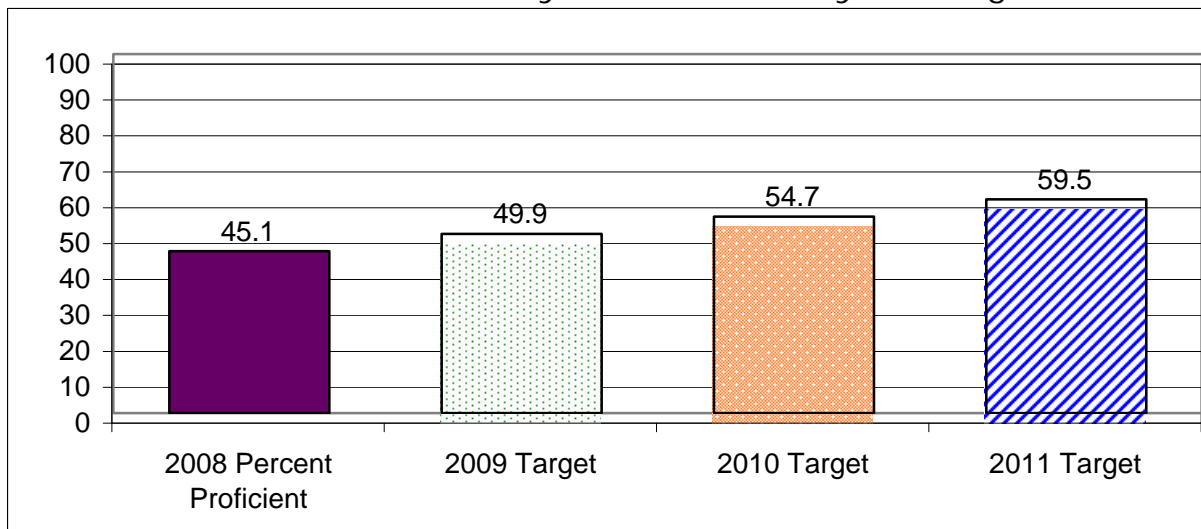

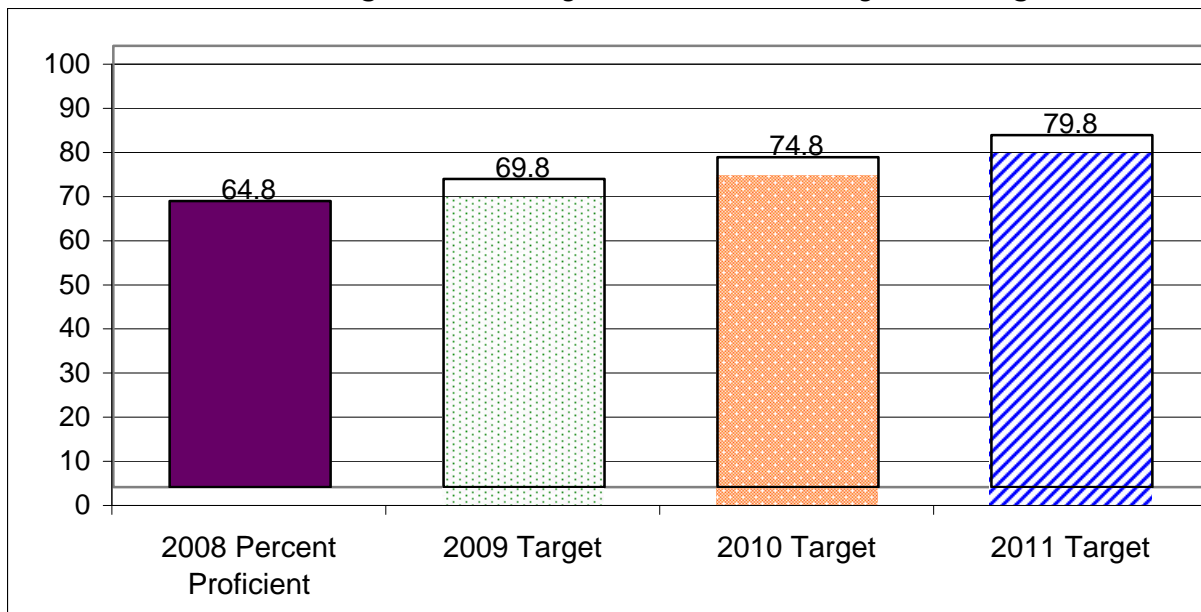
Strategic Objective I

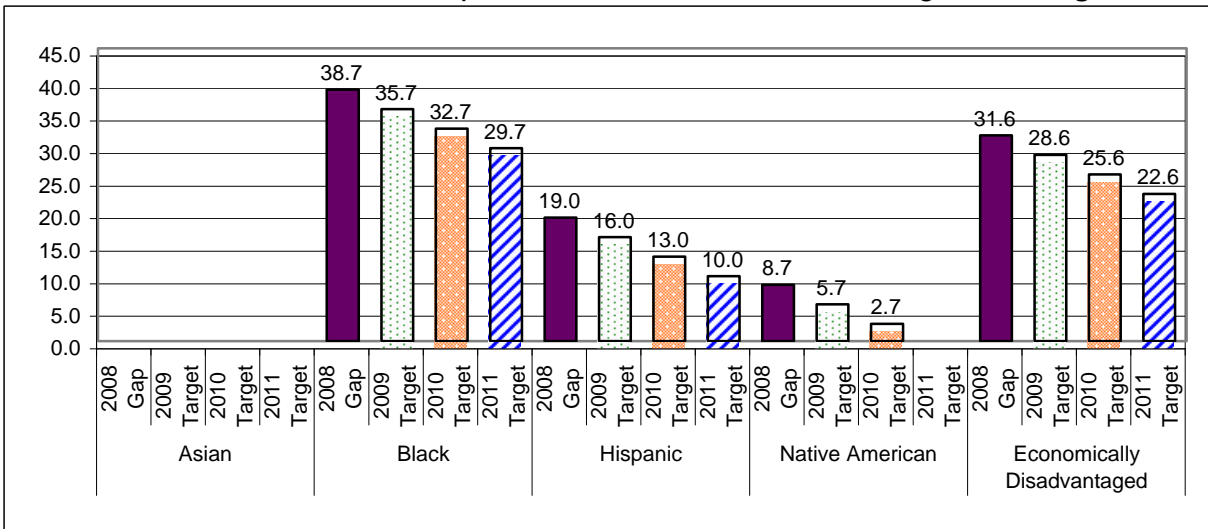

Close achievement gaps.

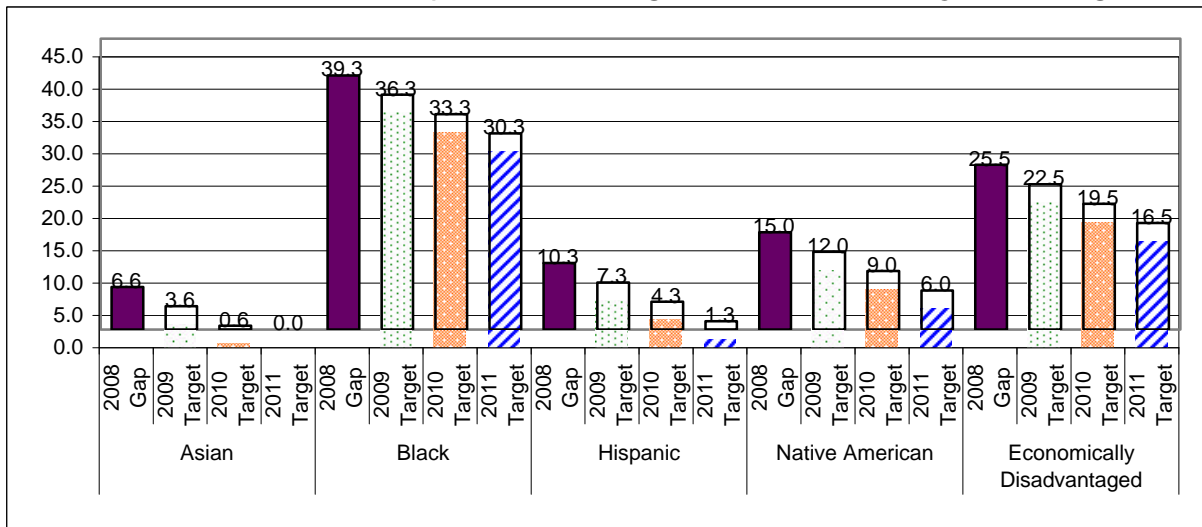

SBA Achievement Gap for Reading, Baseline and 3-year Targets



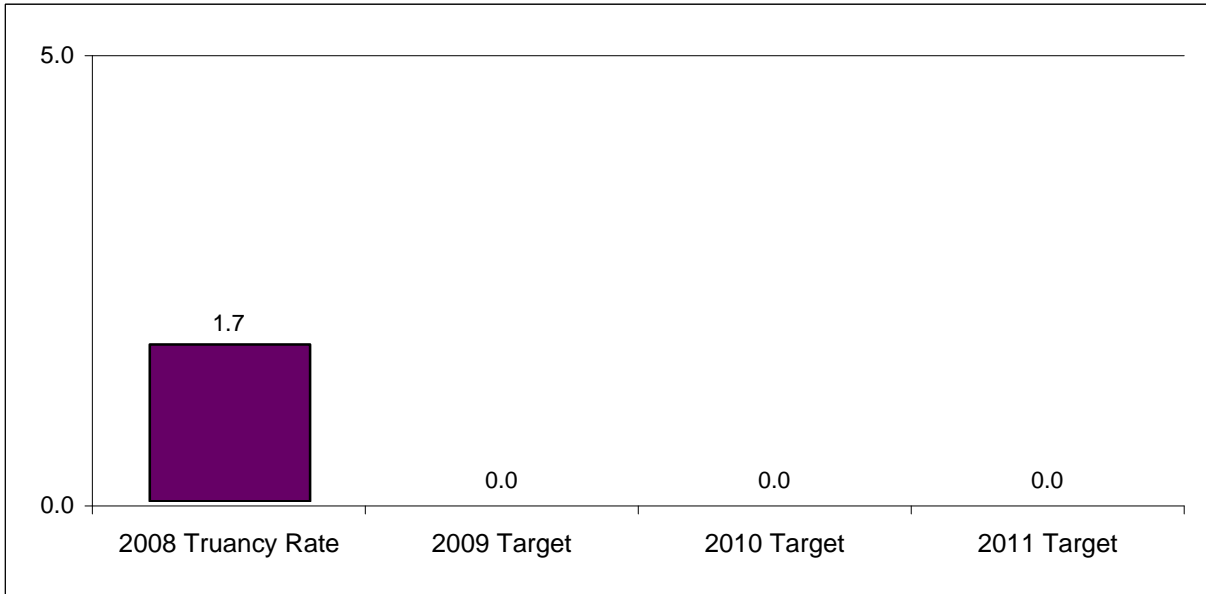

The NM PED calculates attendance rates using only unexcused absences. Source: Cognos 09/08

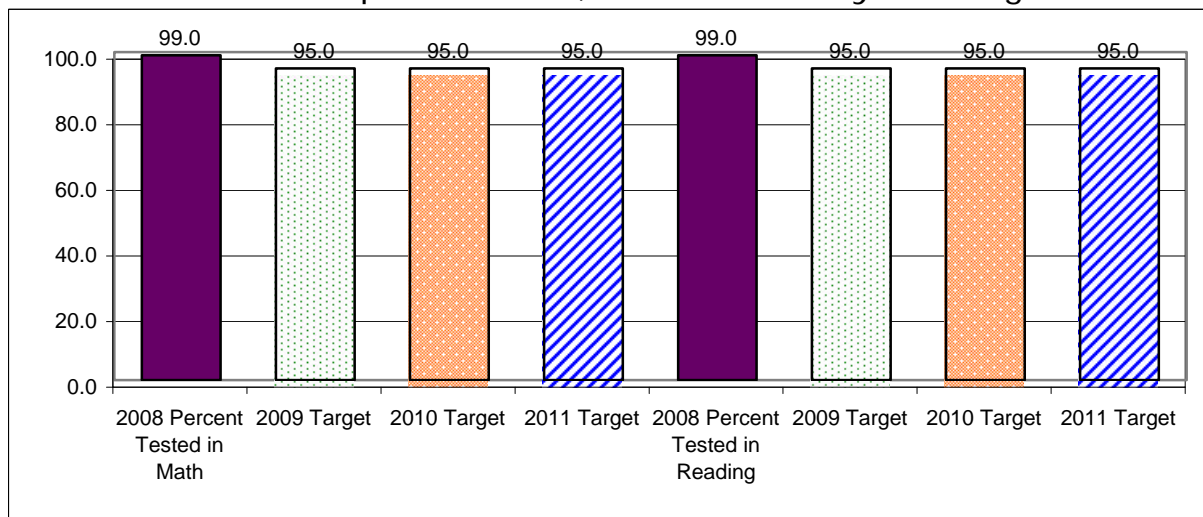
